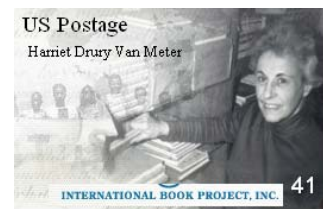

Old Sylvester’s Site, Moore’s Lake Property Up for Rezoning

Chester Village News, Aug 8, 2007.

Broad Street Partners LLP, owners of the now closed Sylvester’s Restaurant and Moore’s Cottages and the former Chesterfield Feed and Seed on Jefferson Davis Hwy., have begun the process to rezone that property and a group of properties to the east of I-95. They intend to develop a mixed-use project consisting of retail and restaurants on the road frontage, multi-family residential dwellings on the old Moore’s Lake Property, and industrial along the I-95 corridor. The only reported tenant to date is a **Texas Roadhouse Restaurant**. Development would not occur until after the fourth quarter of 2008. *What next?*
